Further from the sun, past a ring of asteroids, lies the largest planet in our solar system -- Jupiter -- the first of the gas giant planets. Its characteristic colored cloud patterns are caused by enormous, swirling storms in its atmosphere, which consists of primarily of hydrogen, helium, methane ammonia and water ice.

All four Jovian planets have multiple moons, sport ring systems, have no solid surface and are immense. The largest Jovian is also the largest planet in the solar system, Jupiter. Nearby is Saturn, the solar system's second largest planet. Its signature rings are wide enough to fit between Earth and the moon, but are barely a kilometer thick.

How Many Moons Are in Our Solar System? Naturally-formed bodies that orbit planets are called moons, or planetary satellites. The best-known planetary satellite is, of course, Earth's Moon. Solar System Formation. The solar system is located in one of the spiral arms of the Milky Way galaxy. It was born about 4.5 billion years ago when a cloud of interstellar gas and dust collapsed. Most of the material was pulled toward a central point: nearly all of the solar system's mass--99.8%--is in the Sun.

There are eight planets in the solar system and several dwarf planets, such as Pluto and Ceres. According to the most widely accepted definition of a planet, there are eight planets in our solar system: Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune. Pluto, Eris, Haumea, Makemake, and Ceres are dwarf planets. But, there are a host ...

Second Stop: Giant Planets. Our solar system has four giant planets: Neptune, Uranus, Saturn, and Jupiter. Giant planets are much larger than Earth--they are unimaginably huge, stunningly beautiful, and sometimes a little weird. Our solar system extends much farther than the eight planets that orbit the Sun. The solar system also includes the Kuiper Belt that lies past Neptune's orbit. This is a sparsely occupied ring of icy bodies, almost all smaller than the most popular Kuiper Belt Object - dwarf planet Pluto.
