From 2007 Italy introduced a minimum quota of 4.5% of biofuels to be fed into the network by 2012. A reduction in the tax on biofuels was also introduced prior to 2010.

On December 9, 2023 the Italian Government approved Law Decree No. 181/2023 (the "Energy Decree"), which was converted with amendments into Law No. 11 of February 2, 2024.
