Just over a week earlier, Georgiy Kizyun, 69, was killed when a blaze sparked by a lithium-ion battery trapped him inside a Brooklyn apartment on Oct. 16, according to cops and fire officials.

So far this year, there have been 108 lithium-ion battery fires in New York City, which have injured 66 people and killed 13, up from 98 fires that had injured 40 and killed two at this time last year. The most recent was a fire at an e-bike shop that killed four people near midnight on the morning of June 21 and left two individuals in critical condition and one ...

Fires caused by batteries that power e-micromobility devices are a significant problem in New York City, growing from 44 in 2020 to 220 in 2022. These fires are particularly severe and difficult to extinguish, spreading quickly and producing noxious fumes. From 2021 to 2022, these fires resulted in 10 deaths and 226 injuries.

Do not try to put the fire out yourself. Lithium-ion battery fires spread quickly, aggressively, and can become explosive or reignite. Water may not prevent a battery from burning and fire extinguishers do not work on lithium-ion battery fires. The safest decision you can make is leave the area immediately and call 9-1-1.

What are some examples of fires lithium-ion batteries have started in the city? A 7-year old boy and a 19-year-old girl died in a fire caused by a lithium-ion battery that erupted in April in ...

"Almost every day, New York City is reminded of the escalating and continuing threat lithium-ion batteries pose to the public's safety and to our brave first responders," said U.S. Representative Ritchie Torres.

The FDNY says so far this year there have been 126 fires involving lithium-ion batteries in electric bikes and scooters. These fires have killed five people, including a 5-year-old girl and 36-year-old woman at the Jackie Robinson Houses in East Harlem on Aug. 3.
