Mnemonics for the Metric System. The eight planets in order in the solar system--Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, Neptune--can be remembered with a few different mnemonics: My Very Educated Mother Just Served Us Noodles; My Very Excellent Mother Just Sent Us Nachos; Before 2006, Pluto was the ninth planet in the solar system.

To remember the order of the planets in our solar system, mnemonic devices and creative techniques can be highly effective. One popular mnemonic is "My Very Educated Mother Just Served Us Nachos," which represents the order of the planets from the Sun outward: Mercury, Venus, Earth, Mars, Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune. ...

"Many Very Educated Men Just Screwed Up Nature" - this mnemonic is mentioned by Mike Brown, who discovered Eris. [9] Another mnemonic which was changed from 9 to 8 planets was, "Most Very Elderly Men Just Slept Under Newspapers" [citation needed]

Instead of simply memorizing a list, you can come up with an inventive way of remembering it. If the mnemonic device is humorous, then there's a better chance you'll be able to recall it. For example, take a look at this mnemonic for remembering the distance of the planets in our solar system from the sun:

Individual Planets in Mnemonic Sentence Mercury. Mercury is the closest planet to the sun and the smallest planet in our solar system. It is named after the Roman messenger god because of its fast orbit around the sun. Mercury has a very thin atmosphere and extreme temperature changes between its day and night sides. Despite its small size, Mercury has a ...

Steps Mnemonics. Make up a silly sentence. A mnemonic device is a trick that you can use to help you remember something. Use acrostics, or silly sentences, which start with the first initial of each planet name, to help you remember the order, starting with Mercury and ending with Neptune (Pluto has been changed to a "dwarf planet" so it doesn't count as an actual planet) ...

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The Solar System consists of 8 (9) planets which you are going to want to remember. These are: Mercury; Venus; Earth; Mars; Jupiter; Saturn; Uranus; Neptune; In that order. Pluto was up until very recently considered to be a planet and the farthest one away from the sun.
