

Saying for order of planets

For example, the inner planets are rocky due to their proximity to the Sun, while the outer planets are gas and ice giants. The order and arrangement of the planets and other bodies in our solar system is due to the way the solar system formed. Nearest to the Sun, only rocky material could withstand the heat when the solar system was young. For this reason, the first four planets - Mercury, Venus, Earth, and Mars - are terrestrial planets.

You can also listen to a catchy song that has the order of the planets in it or listen to a recording of yourself saying the planets in order over and over again. If you're a visual learner, try writing down the order of the planets several times on a piece of paper until you remember.

They start with the nearest planet to the Sun. The most common way to order the planets is by their distance

from the Sun (starting with the closest one, Mercury). The easiest way to remember the order of the planets is to come up with a mnemonic phrase. The first letter of each word will correspond to the beginning letter of the planet.

Most of the major planets also have atmospheres. Earth's is composed mainly of nitrogen and oxygen--key for sustaining life. The atmospheres on terrestrial Venus and Mars are mostly carbon dioxide, while the thick atmospheres of Jupiter, Saturn, Uranus, and Neptune are made primarily of hydrogen and helium. Mercury doesn't have an atmosphere at all.
